Insulin Fact Sheet Cont...

Quick Tips

- Sliding scale and meal time insulin should be combined and given as one injection
- Pre meal insulin is given to cover the anticipated rise in BG after the meal.
- Holding insulin can result in hyperglycemia post meal.
- *Regular* insulin is given 30-45 min before the meal.
- *Lispro* is given 15 min up to the time of the meal.
- *Lantus* "stings" and should be given slowly.
- If blood glucose is below 70mg/dl call MD to determine amount of insulin to be given.
- *Metformin* is eliminated by the kidneys. Hold 24 hr. prior to contrast and 48 hr. after contrast.
