#### Strategy Three: Buckhannon Rotary Blood Screenings at SJH

**Priority Targeted:** A multi-weekend community event will be held at St. Joseph's Hospital on four to six Saturdays in the summer of 2020, and will include glucose screenings among other blood chemistry information. This strategy works to target the topic of disease prevention and management. SJH has received multiple inquiries from patients and providers about the Rotary Blood Screenings. Many patients use these as their yearly or bi-annual screenings for a variety of health conditions. This is not intended to replace a SJH-provided screening event that was planned for April and cancelled due to COVID, but will offer a smaller scale option to those who do need testing now and will hopefully ease the volume if the fall SJH fall screening, if it can be offered.
