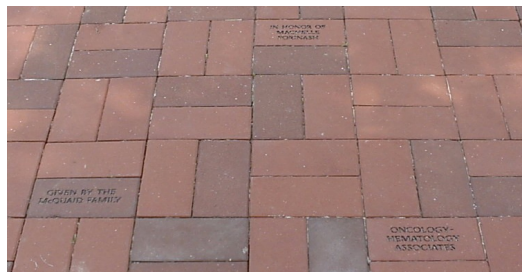

Is the garden only for Memorializing hospice patients?

The contribution levels have been structured so that no less than 50% of the contribution benefits the terminally ill. *Gifts will be acknowledged in an appropriate way and according to the wishes of the donor.*
