Spinal Cord Injury Management Cont..

T6 -T12 Injuries

- Loss of motor and sensory function below the waist
- No loss of respiratory function
- Loss of bowel and bladder control
- ➤ In addition to t! T6 capabilities, complete abdominal, upper back, and respiratory control permit good sitting and balance and wheelchair operation

L1 -L3 Injuries

- Loss of most motor function of the legs and pelvis, and loss of sensation in lower abdomen and legs
- > Retention of knee jerk reflex
- > No loss of respiratory function
- Loss of bowel and bladder control
- ➤ All T1 T12 capabilities

L3 –L4 Injuries

- Loss of motor and sensory function in portions of the lower legs, ankles, and feet
- > No loss of respiratory function
- > Loss of bowel and bladder control
- May achieve walking with braces
