Criteria for Pediatric PRIORITY | Activation Response

Applies to ALL Trauma from scene or transferred patients age ≤16

Priority I Criteria REQUIRED RESPONSE: FULL TRAUMA TEAM ACTIVATION Trauma Attending presence within 15 minutes

- 1. Confirmed blood pressure less than 90 mmHg at any time in adults and age-specific hypotension in children
- 2. Penetrating mechanism (gunshot or stab wounds) to the neck, head, or torso (chest, abdomen, back, pelvis)
- 3. GCS less than 9 with TRAUMA MECHANISM (Not just found down)
- 4. Transfer patients from other hospitals requiring ongoing blood transfusion to maintain vital signs
- 5. Patients presenting with quadriplegia or paraplegia
- 6. Patients intubated in the field and directly transported to the trauma center
- 7. Patients who have respiratory compromise or are in need of an emergent airway
- 8. Transfer patients from another hospital with ongoing respiratory compromise (excludes patients intubated at another facility who are now stable from a respiratory standpoint)
- Tourniquet in place to control hemorrhage (with or without hemodynamic instability)
- 10. Transfer with intracranial hemorrhage and midline shift.
- 11. Emergency physician's discretion.

IF IN DOUBT INITIATE PRIORITY I RESPONSE
