

Priority II Criteria

Trauma Mechanism within 24 hours of presentation

**REQUIRED RESPONSE: PARTIAL TRAUMA TEAM ACTIVATION, PGY 4/5 SURGERY
RESIDENT OR TRAUMA FACULTY PRESENCE WITHIN 15 MINUTES**

Physiology

1. Respiratory Rate <10 or >30 with trauma mechanism
2. GCS >9 and <15 with trauma mechanism

Anatomy

1. Obvious Extremity Vascular Injury (i.e. pulseless extremity) **without** hypotension
2. Crushed Chest/Flail Chest **without** Respiratory Compromise
3. Patient with multiple acute rib fractures (transfer from referring facility)
4. Multiple Proximal Extremity Fractures (Combination of **2** of the following: Femur, Humerus)
5. Pelvic Fractures (**without** hypotension)
6. Suspected or confirmed spinal fractures with or without neurologic deficits/symptoms (ex.: paresthesias, isolated extremity weakness)
7. Combination Trauma with Burns > 10%
8. Amputations proximal to wrist or ankle
9. Open or depressed skull fracture
10. Documented Intra-Cranial Hemorrhage with GCS > 9
11. Documented Leforte II or III **without** respiratory compromise
12. Seatbelt Sign

Mechanism

1. Ejection from Vehicle
2. Death in Same Passenger Compartment
3. Falls >10 feet
4. High-Speed Auto Crash – >40 mph
5. Automobile vs pedestrian or cyclist >20 mph
6. Motorcycle/ATV Crash > 20 mph or with Separation of Rider and Vehicle
7. Emergency Physician's Discretion

IF IN DOUBT INITIATE PRIORITY II RESPONSE
