Geriatric Fracture Service (MHS-6) Admission Criteria

Geriatric Fracture Service Admission Criteria from Emergency Department

- Age- 65 years and older
- Mechanism Ground Level Fall/Fall from bed/wheelchair
 - Excluded: MVC, MCC, ATV/UTV Accident, Fall from Height > 10 feet, Penetrating Trauma
- Injuries
 - No injuries identified, admitted for syncopal workup or medical issues
 - Isolated Extremity Fracture (operative or non-op),
 - Additional single additional non-op extremity fractures (such as hand or wrist fracture) can also be admitted to MHS-6.
 - o Isolated Pelvic Fracture without active extravasation,
 - Such as pubic ramus, iliac wing
 - Not needing IR or operative intervention
 - Admitted to Step down or floor status
 - Isolated Facial Fracture,
 - Non operative,
 - Admitted to Step Down or floor status
 - No concern for airway compromise
 - Excluded:
 - Patients with any acute Non-Extremity Injuries, Solid Organ injury, Acute Spine Fractures, Intracranial Hemorrhage, Rib Fractures, Complex Pelvic Fractures (open-book)
 - Evidence of Retroperitoneal Hematoma, Compartment syndrome, Vascular Injury
- Acuity: meets Step down or Floor status criteria
 - If Requiring ICU admission-Trauma consulted for evaluation discussion with trauma attending for admission to SICU vs MICU
- If not meeting Trauma Activation Criteria (P1,P2, or P3)
 - o Trauma consulted and called upon admission by the Emergency Department/MHS-6
