TRANSRECTAL ULTRASOUND



Your doctor has referred you for a transrectal ultrasound. This examination uses sound waves to produce images of body parts. Please report to the 4C's building, 1st floor, Suite 107.

Indications for transrectal ultrasound are:

- Clinical staging of a patient with rectal carcinoma
- Evaluation of malignant or benign perirectal tumors
- Evaluation of anal and/or rectal perirectal abscesses
- Evaluation of patients who have had definitive treatment for carcinoma of the rectum where recurrent disease is noted.

There are no dietary restrictions. You may eat and take your medications at your normal times. When you arrive, the nurse will have you to change into a hospital gown removing only your clothing from the waist down. You will be lying on your left side on the bed during the examination.

PREP: 2 Fleet Enemas 2 hours prior to your scheduled appointment time. (If you have a

long travel time to the hospital, adjust time for enemas accordingly).

LENGTH: 20-45 minutes (depending on the extent of testing needed)
